Wheelchair Distribution

In the fall of 2007, Pastor Gervase and the PMC received a 40 foot container from Free Wheelchair Mission in California. We gave 10 wheelchairs to Kurasini Salvation Army Primary School. These were free for distribution to ministries in Tanzania.

The PMC turned ten chairs over to the Hurassini Salvation Army Private School. Here they heard the stories of some of these children; stories that touched their hearts and moved them to tears, as they heard of children being rejected and abandoned, or chased away. But then the Salvation Army had collected them, and now they were doing fine in the school, having hope at last.

They also served food and drinks to 170 children, and pledged to provide more wheelchairs, clothing and shoes and crutches.
